The collection has a strong connection to the Badger State. David deGroot, the collection's first curator, was born and raised in Green Bay. He attended UW-Milwaukee and earned his music BFA there, followed by MFA at New England Conservatory in Boston. He has written and traveled the world to teach the principles of bonsai. He has been a guest of the Badger Bonsai Society on two occasions.

At the end of 2013 the corporation gifted the entire collection to a new non-profit, The George Weyerhaeuser Pacific Rim Bonsai Collection, known as the Pacific Bonsai Museum.
