The main portion of the evening we will look at some photos from 2018 Taikan-ten bonsai exhibition in Japan. If we wish to improve our own design capabilities, we have to have a mental image of what good bonsai looks like. And like so much of what Yogi said, after an initial 'huh?', you start to appreciate how profound some of these quips are.
