Amur Maple Design Concepts

Thanks again to Tim for opening his property for an Amur Maple Dig on Saturday Apr-10th. About a dozen people attended, enjoyed excellent weather, and harvested a lot of trees. For our principal topic at our Jun-10th meeting, we would like all "diggers" to bring their harvested trees to show to the membership and discuss their plans for their tree — or if you are at a standstill, to ask for feedback on member's ideas. Please feel free to bring along any sketches or ideas you have.

From BCI: Amur maple has only started to attain popularity as a bonsai. It is certain to become widely used as it is an attractive, fussfree maple. See the rest of this good overview of the Amur Maple for bonsai.

Also note that the Amur Maple, like many other maples can be wired, but extreme care and usually protecting the branches with raffia is recommended to prevent damage over the duration of the wire on the tree.

Here are some good YouTube videos with regard to using Amur Maples for bonsai. Note the Dave's Bonsai video (Dave is from Minnesota) is extremely interesting, as there is not a lot of actual pruning until a lot of thought and consideration about options ... it really is worth the watch!

Beginner's Corner ... Styles

As the principal focus at the June meeting will be on your discussion of plans for your Amur maples (or other trees you choose to bring in), it would wise to review / refresh / reacquaint yourself with the styles that are most common for bonsai. While you will quite often today see some variations on the traditional bonsai styles, understanding the concepts and intent behind

these styles can guide you as you develop your own trees, and even as you are looking for trees or stock to develop into bonsai.

Almost every book on bonsai that exists will include a basic discussion of these styles, and others will go into great detail (for example the David DeGroot book Basic Bonsai Design) for each style.

The BBS has quite range of books in our library ... remember, if you are a BBS member, you can borrow any of our books and magazines or media ... see the BBS website for details.

We actually have a good article on the Badger Bonsai Society website that was compiled from Wikipedia in 2008 that provides a good overview of the traditional styles. Have a look, and see where it leads you.

Note that the manilla identity card at the front-right or front-left of each image is 3.5 inches wide, so you can use that to judge the size of the bonsai tree in the images.
