# President's Message

WOW ... how time flies, especially it seems this past year. Once again our short Wisconsin growing season is starting to show signs that it will soon be time for your trees to be put away for winter. Even already some of the night temperatures should have you on your toes with regard to any tropicals, and even some of the less hardy deciduous trees — then we get hit with another bout of heat spells and inconsistent rains.

As important as these decisions can be to your bonsai collections, this is not the type of thing that you should really procrastinate about or put off until the last moment (remember, do as I say, not as I do) ... now is the time to develop / revisit your approach to wintering your trees, and especially assess what you did last year that did or did not work for you.

Over the past years, we (the BBS) have seen a

substantial increase in our membership — many who are new to bonsai and looking for guidance (and concern) about how to winter their trees, especially in our area of Wisconsin.

Our Sep-9th meeting at Olbrich Gardens, had a total of 18 attendees, with 1 first time attendee. Thanks to Karl for discussions on his donated boxwood cuttings and air layering concept; Ken for comments on his "1st workshop experience"; and to members' show-n-tell trees (TimO - Scotch Pine; Jason - Ficus; Jon - Japanese Black Pine; Zach - Juniper Pfitzeriana).

Our Oct-14th meeting will be held in the Olbrich Gardens Upstairs Meeting Room; our normal 2nd floor meeting location. We'll again use a theatre style seating with fewer tables to provide greater seating capacity and a better opportunity for safe distancing as needed. *This meeting ends at 9pm.*

enough to catch some of Ralph's excellent chrysanthemums in full bloom. We are also planning on brief presentations and discussions of several bonsai design styles (informal upright, formal upright and cascades) along with several examples of styled trees, as well as some examples of un-styled trees (planning to be styled these ways in the spring). In addition we should also have open nominations for BBS officers for the 2022 year (with voting at Nov-11th meeting). We would like to discuss what you can look for in late-season local nursery finds ... though many members have reported that there is not very much available this year ... probably another consequence of this past year's COVID challenges with nurserieis and growers.

A couple of other topics that we want to discuss is different options of containers for training your trees ... you don't always want to go right into a high quality bonsai pot (that can be very expensive). If you have some examples, bring them along. We also want to kick around the idea of a soil mixing session at one of our upcoming winter-month meetings.

# Recap of Sep-9th meeting

Though Karl was not able to attend the Aug-12th meeting where his Kingsville Boxwood cuttings were distributed, he brought along several examples of these trees from his collection and described the history, key characteristics and care tips for these new plants.





Karl also brought in a maple that he has been working on propogating by the air layering technique. Though relatively simple in concept, successful air layering is very sensitive to preparation technique and post-layering care and monitoring — Karl explained the basic approach and invited all to use Google to explore the many excellent tutorials and videos.
