Recap of Jun-9th meeting

As we noted elsewhere in the newsletter, new member Tyler indicated his employer will allow the BBS to use his workspace when needed, so we will have a July meeting (see page 3 details).

Show'n'tells consisted of Paolo (boxwood), Alex (azalea), Tony ("highway-M" juniper that is prospering after about 5 years), Colin (flowering red currant), Jon (shimpaku from Brussels) ... thanks to all for their trees and discussion.

Multiple people (Jason, Ken, Mary, Ron, Skylar and Zach) brought in their Larch bonsai for preseentation and discussion. The larch is a particularly attractive tree for bonsai (see below for an excellent example in the Milwaukee Bonsai Collection). Trees ranged from freshly acquired nursery stock to well established bonsai. Ron (of Ancient Arts Bonsai) is well versed in the challenges of working with Larch, especially in the southern-WI area. At this time of year, the primary activity that "can be safe" for the tree is pruning back the new growth. Ron showed the proper method of cutback, just above a fresh bud (see detailed picture below-left) in order to effectively reduce the tree size and increase the ramification in the developing tree. Hopefully we will see these trees again in the months to come!

Wisco Bonsai Jul-24th Tropical Workshop

Hope your summer is going well and that your trees are thriving !!!

Speaking of thriving, how about those Tropical Bonsai you might own?

What sort of substrate (and pot) are they in? Are they THRIVING? Or just SURVIVING?

For most folks new to bonsai, I am willing to wager they are surviving, but maybe not thriving as they should be and alot of that will have to do with what they are planted in !

Whether it is that Ginseng Ficus you bought at Walmart or an ancient Buttonwood that you simply need assistance with, this workshop is geared toward getting the most out of your Tropical material.

This will be run as an "open workshop" — you need only RSVP via email and then show up at the Wisco Bonsai Studio on Sunday July 24th sometime between 10am and 3pm (no prepayment needed).

The cost is \$25 per tree and that includes assisted instruction, substrate, wire, drainage screening, and use of all repotting tools. We will be sifting and mixing custom substrate for each tree. Most trees can go right back into the same pot they came in, but for those wishing to change pots for stylistic or horticultural reasons, a variety of bonsai pots are available for purchase in the shop. So, thats about it for this one... Easy !!! *Just RSVP to the email below and then show up with your tree* !!!
