Highlights of the show include a bring-your-own-tree workshop with guest master <u>Bjorn Bjorholm</u>, a conifer styling demonstration by Bjorn, a guided tour of Chicago Botanic Gardens' permanent collection, screening of documentary "Edo Advant-Gard," several other workshops by well-known bonsai artists, and an informal dinner with a silent auction and raffle of the tree styled by Bjorn.


There are plenty of opportunities to get your bonsai fix in the coming weeks. Get out there, maximize your bonsai experiences, and be inspired.


