The fair will run through August 13. The Rotating Bonsai Display presented by the Milwaukee Bonsai Society is in the Grand Champion Building.




# Raffle Prize Winners

Wayne wins a training pot with knobs to tie guy wires and extra holes for air root pruning. A useful tool for any bonsai enthusiast's arsenal.








## Show & Tell






Alex's new Eastern red cedar battled an ant colony, and cedar apple rust and lived to tell the tale.
