Here's why you should consider taking part in our Bonsai Exhibit on May 17th and 18th.

Preparing a tree for exhibit encourages you to look at it with fresh eyes. Is the pot appropriate? Are the branches balanced? Does the display reflect the tree's character? This kind of attention helps elevate your skills and deepens your understanding of aesthetics and horticulture.

An exhibit opens the door to constructive feedback from fellow enthusiasts and the show judge. Whether it's a helpful tip from a more experienced member or a new perspective on your design choices, feedback is a gift that can guide your next steps in development.

Showing your work, even if it's still in progress, can be a great confidence booster. Every artist starts somewhere, and club exhibits are a supportive environment where everyone is encouraged to share their growth—literally and figuratively.

Your tree might be the one that catches a beginner's eye and gets them hooked on bonsai. That's what got me to join BBS. Exhibits are as much about community and inspiration as they are about technique. You never know who you might motivate by simply showing up.

Participation is what keeps our club vibrant. The more members who contribute to exhibits, the richer and more dynamic the experience is for everyone. It's a celebration of our shared passion and a great way to connect.

Trees in Training

Our *Trees in Training* table is designed to highlight trees that are works in progress. This is a low-pressure, educational exhibit that celebrates the journey of bonsai cultivation, not just the final result. If you've ever thought, "My tree isn't ready to show yet," this exhibit is for you!

Here are some examples of what we need for our Trees in Training table:

- Pre-bonsai that are still developing their structure or style.
- Examples of visible wiring, pruning cuts, or recent work.
- Leaf or needle size comparison (before vs. after pruning/defoliation)
- Photos or sketches of earlier stages
- Visible propagation work such a air-layering or cuttings.
- Seedlings in early training.
- Nursery stock in training.
- Training pots, plastic nursery containers, or grow boxes.
