While bonsai is often a long-term meditation in patience and form, kusamono offers a more immediate sense of satisfaction. These elegant arrangements of grasses, mosses, and seasonal plants are designed to stand alone as works of art—or to complement a bonsai display. For those looking to explore new creative paths, kusamono is one of many related art forms that deepens our appreciation for nature and composition.

We're thrilled to welcome renowned kusamono artist Young Choe for a live demonstration at our July meeting. Trained in traditional art in Korea, Young studied horticulture at the University of Maryland and refined her kusamono practice in Japan under master Keiko Yamane of the Omiya Bonsai Museum. She is celebrated for bringing a poetic sensitivity to her plantings, evoking natural landscapes in miniature.

Choosing the Right Kusamono Pot

Selecting a pot for kusamono is part of the creative process. The container should harmonize with the plant's size, color, and seasonal message. Unglazed or subtly glazed ceramics often work best, as they let the planting take center



stage. Shallow, irregular, or handmade pots can add rustic charm or emphasize the wild, natural feel kusamono is known for.

Whether you're new to the art or a long-time bonsai enthusiast, kusamono can offer fresh inspiration—and instant beauty. Don't miss this opportunity to learn from a master!




